MEET THE CLYMER FAMILY

"I didn't want to go home. I would feel completely helpless if something happened to him"

Christina Clymer arrived at her doctor's appointment for what she thought would be a routine third-trimester checkup. By midnight, she was being airlifted hundreds of miles away from her husband, two daughters, and her home, with the fate of her unborn child unknown.

The following day her husband Larz rushed to Christina's side at Wesley Medical Center in Wichita, KS as she prepared for an emergency C-section, and the birth of their son 3 months early.

Leo was born weighing only 2 pounds 5.8 ounces. "It was hard because I wasn't used to holding something so small," Christina remembered. He was sent immediately to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and both Larz and Christina didn't want to leave their newborn son's side.

"I didn't want to go home, even though he is in good hands. I would feel completely helpless if something happened to him," Christina said.

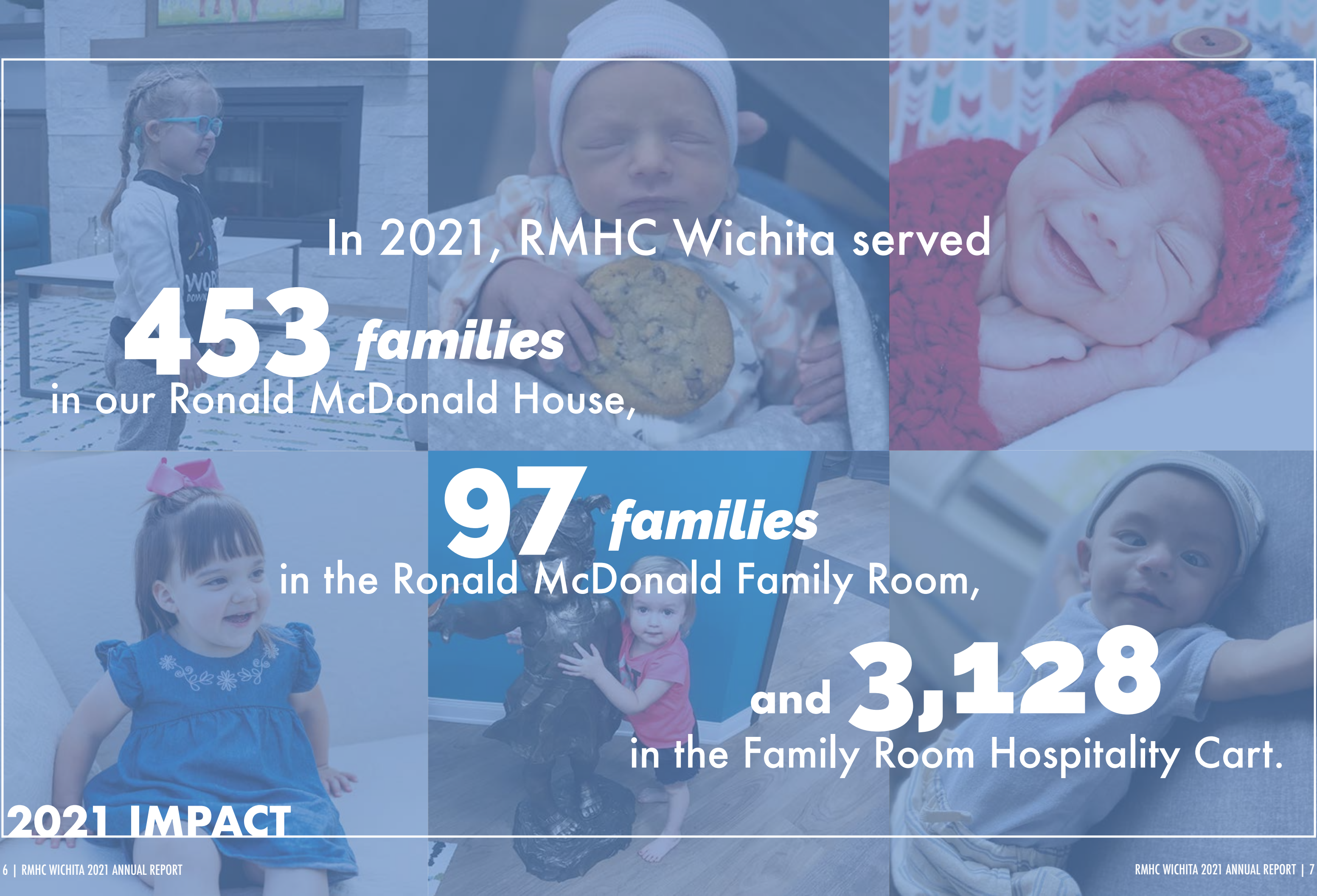
Thankfully, while Larz had to go home for work, Christina was able to stay at the Ronald McDonald House, just steps away from their child.

"It has been great being at the Ronald McDonald House. It takes the stress off of me and my husband where we aren't having to drive back and forth from home to Wichita," explained Christina.

With Leo growing stronger every day, Christina has been thankful for the friendships she has built in the NICU while staying at the Ronald McDonald House.

"Since Leo went to Special Care everyone on our team in the NICU has gone up to see him," stated Christina.

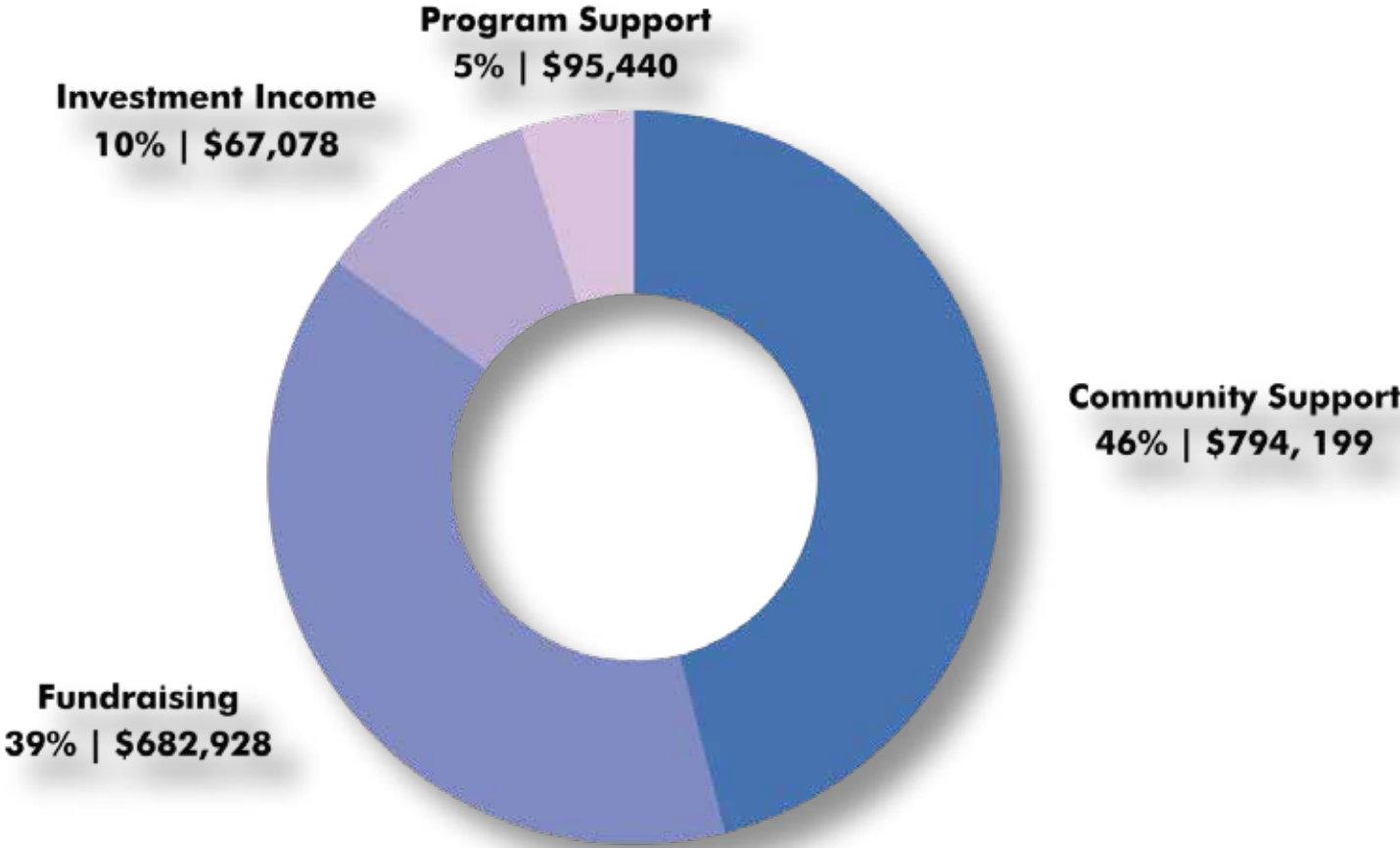

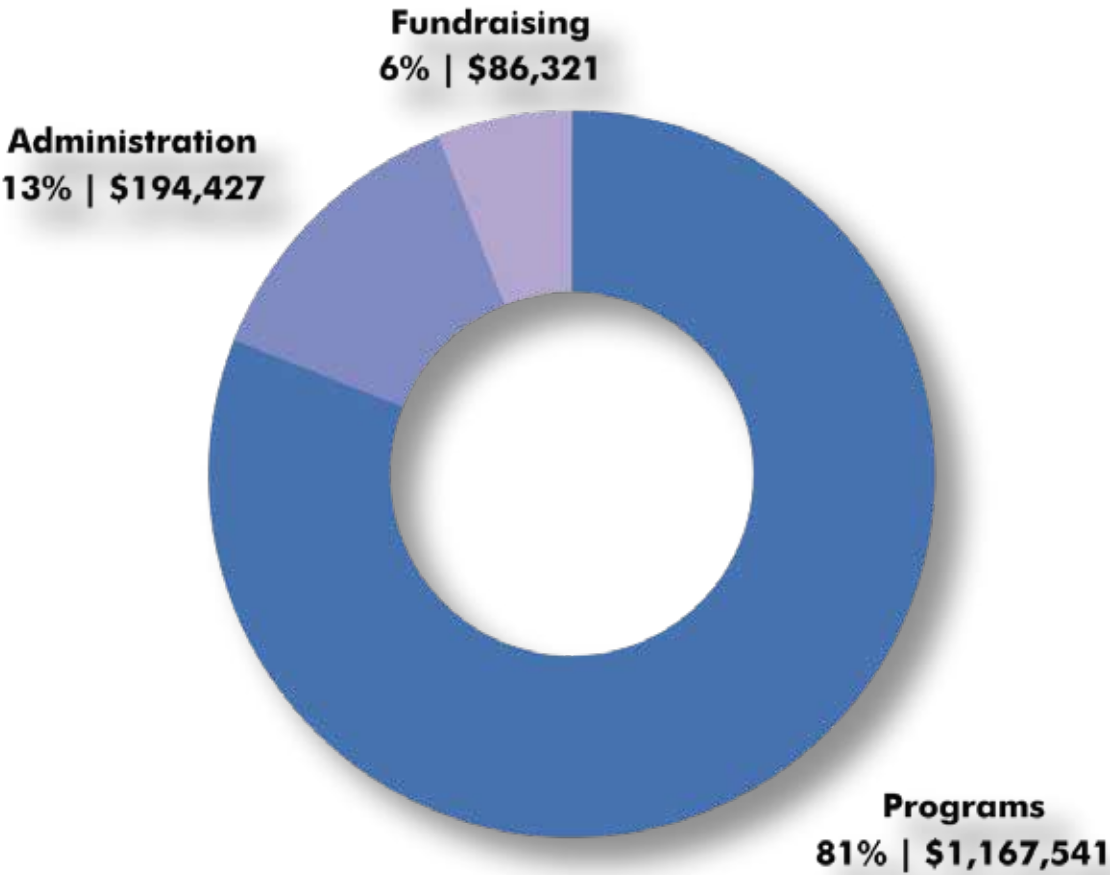
